Re : Victoria Dock, Caernarfon

Further to our recent discussion in respect of the above, and in particular the proposal to establish a berth holders association for the Dock.

As owners of the Dock, Gwynedd Council would very much welcome the opportunity of working with such an organisation for the continuous improvements of facilities and services provided. Indeed, an association comprising berthing customers could be a very useful conduit, particularly in terms of sharing or dissemination of information, identifying key issues, the exchange of ideas and customer feedback.

I would also welcome the approach as outlined in our discussion, particularly in terms of building a constructive dialogue between various parties. Needless to say, the Dock does face a number of challenges, and experience elsewhere (including Pwllheli) demonstrates the importance of working in partnership with key stakeholders and user groups. As part of the process of establishing an association, relevant officers from the department would of course be able to attend to discuss further opportunities for further collaboration.

I have also sent a copy of this letter to Llyr Jones, Economy and Community who has line management responsibilities for the Maritime and Country Parks Service. Incidentally, I am aware that Llyr has been heavily involved with various proposals in Pwllheli, and has valued the ongoing and constructive dialogue with the Pwllheli Marina Berth Holders Association) PMBHA.
